Visiting Supporters Guide

TRAVEL TO THE STADIUM OF LIGHT

From the airport

Newcastle International Airport is roughly a 40-minute drive away. The metro is also available from there to the Stadium of Light and takes approximately 45 minutes.

By bus

Buses are frequent, and numbers E2, 2, 3, 4, 9, 12, 13, 15, 16, 23, 24 and 56 all stop nearby. The city's main bus station, Park Lane Interchange, is within walking distance of the stadium.

By train/metro

Sunderland is the nearest main line station, located 10-15 minutes walk away in the city centre. For journey planning and other rail information, visit National Rail.

The Tyne and Wear Metro serves the stadium via both Stadium of Light and St Peter's stations. After matches, supporters travelling towards South Hylton must board at St Peter's, while those heading northbound towards Newcastle must use Stadium of Light station. Visit Nexus for more information on Metro, including journey planning.

A 'Take the Kids for Free' offer is in place, which is permanent, all day every day, all year round.

By Taxi

Taxis can drop off outside the stadium main entrance for hospitality up to one hour before kick off or outside the Black Cat House Fanatics store any time prior to kick off. An Uber service is available across the city also, please download the Uber app for details.

By Car

The postcode for the stadium is SR5 1SU. Entering this postcode into a sat-nav will direct you to the main entrance to the ground. The stadium is easily accessible from both the A19 and A1 via Wessington Way (A1231).

Via the A19, north or south:

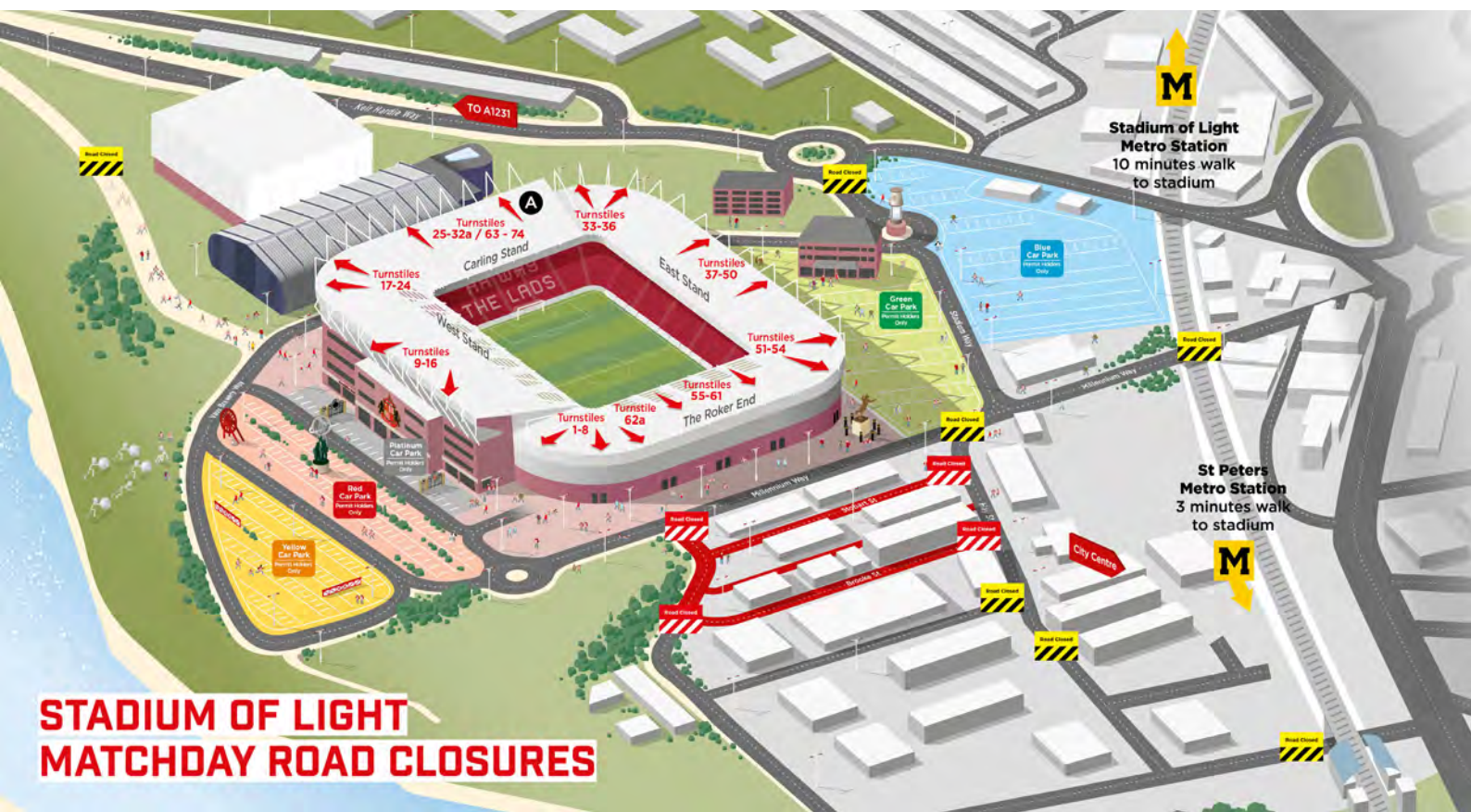
Exit the A19 via the Hylton Grange interchange onto the Wessington Way (A1231). Continuing going on this road through three roundabouts, passing the Northern Spire bridge on your right. Keep going along Wessington Way (A1290) and exit the traffic lights via Queen's Road (A1290). Continue down Keir Hardie Way (A1290) and the stadium will be on your right.

Alternative routes via the A19 (northbound):

Leave the A19 at Seaton and follow the A1018 from there to Sunderland city centre. Head onto the Monkwearmouth bridge (A1018) and turn left at the second set of traffic lights onto Millennium way. Continue on and the stadium will be on your left.

Via the A1

Southbound - Leave the A1 (M) at junction 62 onto the A690. Continue down this road before merging onto the A19. Leave the A19 at the Hylton Grange interchange onto Wessington Way.
Northbound - Leave the A1 at junction 80 and continue down the A19 until you reach the Hylton Grange interchange – leave onto Wessington Way.



INFORMATION FOR DISABLED SUPPORTERS TRAVELLING

Car Parking at the Stadium of Light

There are 8 parking bays reserved for disabled away supporters visiting the Stadium of Light for every fixture. Parking bays are allocated on a first served basis. All bays will be sent to your club to allocate.

If you require parking for the fixture you are attending, please contact your own clubs Disability Liaison Officer.

76 Yards Entrance

All visiting fans that require support with accessing the stadium can use a lift in the 76 Yards to access the away end when they arrive.

Please visit the 76 Yards entrance and request to use the lift to level 3 with the stewards, you will be able to access the lift to visit the away end from there. Once arriving at level 3, there will be a team of stewards available to welcome you and help direct you to the correct seating area/wheelchair platform to watch the game.

FANZONE – BEACON OF LIGHT

The Foundation of Light hosts the official Sunderland AFC Fanzone in their Beacon of Light building on matchdays. Located next to the Stadium of Light, the fanzone area provides a welcoming pre-match build-up for all supporters ahead of their arrival at the Stadium of Light.

The Fanzone is accessible to fans of both teams and opens two and a half hours before kick-off for every home league match at the Stadium of Light.

THE AWAY SECTION IN THE NORTH STAND

Arrival

The away section at the Stadium of Light is located in the North Stand. Visiting supporters can access the stadium using turnstiles 69-74. Turnstiles open 90 minutes before kick off for every game.

Food & Drink

There are two food and drink courtyards within the away end concourse for visiting supporters. Refreshments are available to purchase from the turnstiles opening, during half time and for thirty minutes after full time.

Please note that the Stadium of Light is a cashless stadium, all purchases are card only.

No Smoking

There is a no smoking policy at and around the Stadium of Light. This includes the stadium vicinity, including all car parks.

No readmittance

We operate a strict no readmission policy and there will be no opportunity to leave and re-enter the stadium.

STADIUM OF LIGHT SECURITY

Turnstile Entry

Turnstiles for visiting supporters open 90 minutes before kick off for all games at the Stadium of Light.

Away End turnstiles are numbers 69-74, located in the North Stand.

If any supporter needs lift access to get to the away end, please visit the 76 Yards entrance.

What can I bring into the Stadium of Light

ALLOWED

- Small compact cameras
- Small bags (Smaller than A4)
- Small fold-up umbrellas
- Merchandise purchased in club store
- Non-offensive Flags or Banners smaller than 2mx1m*
- Essential Childcare Items
- Essential Health-related Items

***All flags must not include poles and must meet fire regulations**

NOT ALLOWED

- Alcohol & Canned drinks
- Laptops or Tablets
- Large Cameras
- Air Horns
- Drinking Glasses
- Glass Bottles
- Sports Bottles & Flasks
- Video Recording Equipment
- Buggies & Prams
- Large Umbrella
- Knives or Weapons
- Large Bins
- Fireworks or Flares
- Tools
- Poles or Sticks
- Smoke Gas Canisters
- Offensive Flags or Banners larger than 2mx1m*
- Musical Instruments
- Plastic Bottles

Reporting an Incident

Sunderland AFC is committed to ensuring the Stadium of Light is a safe and welcoming place for all.

In order to effectively tackle discriminatory and anti-social behaviour, we offer an anonymous matchday reporting service for supporters.

If you witness any acts of hate, discrimination or any other type of abusive behaviour, simply text 60060.

Start your text with 'SAFC', followed by the details of the incident and a member of our team will receive this immediately.

You will subsequently receive an automated reply and should continue to use 'SAFC' at the start of all subsequent texts.

Alternatively, you can also report a concern by contacting our EDI Lead or by reaching out to Kick It Out.

Advanced Search Policy

For selected away fixtures, there may be in an advanced search at the away turnstiles in place.

If the fixture you are attending has an advanced search in place, this will be clearly communicated with your club and promoted a few weeks before the fixture on your own clubs website.

For the advanced search the following items cannot be brought into the stadium.

- Coins
- Vapes
- Power banks
- Flares
- Smoke Canisters
- Umbrellas

Please note that all coins collected will be donated to a charity of your own clubs choice following the fixture.

For vapes, power banks, umbrellas and any other larger items a collection procedure is in place. You can leave your item with our steward team before entry, you will be provided with a collection ticket and can return to the same area to collect your item(s) from the steward team after the game.
